EATING DISORDERS: Creating Healthy Eating Choices and a Positive Body Image

For reasons that are unclear, some teens, mainly young women, develop potentially life threatening eating disorders called bulimia nervosa and anorexia nervosa. Those with bulimia indulge in bingeing (episodes of eating large amounts of food) and purging (getting rid of the food from the body by vomiting, using laxatives or diuretics). Those with anorexia, severely limit their food intake. About half of anorexics also suffer from bulimia symptoms. Health professionals discuss the ways in which to help create a positive body image and how important it is to provide physical, intellectual and spiritual guidance to help teens make healthy life choices. 21 minutes


YOUTH IN PRISON: Giving Hope and New Direction

The number of violent crimes committed by juveniles continues to rise alarmingly. In response, the courts are sentencing more young offenders to tough prison terms. What, specifically, is being done to show these kids a different path? Is there any hope for young people in prison? A ZEN LIFE: D.T. Suzuki

BLESSINGS: The Tsoknyi Nangchen Nuns of Tibet

This documentary explores the lives and assess the needs of the Tsoknyi Nangchen Nuns - 3000 remarkable women who live and practice an ancient yogic tradition in nunneries and hermitages scattered across this remote, mountainous region of Nangchen. The women speak about why they became nuns and what it is like to live a life dedicated to spiritual practice. We see the exchange between them and the western women who have come to offer their help and who find their lives immeasurably enriched by the wisdom, simplicity and good humor of the Nangchen nuns. 



FULL COVER GIRL: How Fundamentalism and Democracy Are Eroding Women's Rights in Iraq



KENNEWICK MAN: An Epic Drama of the West

On July 28th, 1996, two college students stumbled upon an anthropological find that would change forever the way North Americans view their past. A human skull turned out to be one of the oldest and most complete skeletons ever found in North America. James Chatters, the anthropologist who eventually investigated the skeleton, determined that the skull had "Caucasoid" features. The word, "Caucasoid," and the subsequent carbon dating of the bones, which found them to be over 9,000 years old, ignited a firestorm of controversy. **These events pitted science against religion and scientists against Native Americans.** The scientists demanded the right to study the bones. The Umatilla Tribe believed the bones to be sacred and ancestral and should be repatriated to the tribes for reburial. The American government caught in the middle because that the remains were found on Federal land, decided to repatriate the remains to the Tribe. Eight scientists then filed a lawsuit to block this, claiming that more study was needed to determine ownership. **The documentary explores with humor and compassion the cultural assumptions and differing opinions among the various groups involved, and attempts to explain why so many have claimed the bones of Kennewick Man.** The far-reaching implications for the future of American anthropology, our view of America's ancient past, and the present day relationship between Native and non-native people are addressed.




REEL BAD ARABS: How Hollywood Vilifies a People
